Wee Hock Kee CA(M), FCCA, CFIIA, CRMA (US)

Wee Hock Kee is the Managing Partner of CG Board Asia Pacific providing learning & leadership development in governance, risk management and internal control (GRC).

Wee began his career as an internal audit trainee in Fraser & Neave in 1985 and within a span of 20 years he rose to the position of Regional Audit Director at AstraZeneca (UK) responsible for Asia Pacific, Middle East and Africa.

As part of the senior management team of AstraZeneca Global Internal Audit, he was responsible for developing and charting the Group's governance and risk management strategy, one of the key milestones was global compliance to Sarbanes Oxley Act. In 2001, he won the Malaysian Internal Auditor of the Year Award.



He has worked in a number of multinational companies as Chief Audit Executive. His industry experience ranges from food and beverage, automobile, industrial chemical, property development, hotel and leisure and pharmaceutical. He has conducted numerous trainings for C suite managers/board members of PLCs on the implementation of GRC. Wee was a former Independent Director of a PLC and was recently appointed to the board of an upcoming IPO company.

Wee was the former President of IIA Malaysia and Asian Confederation of Internal Auditors. He was also a former board member of IIA Global US and Chairman of the IIA 2011 International Conference in KL. He is a faculty member of MACD and MINDA to their directors and senior management training programme.

He managed and developed the governance charter and schedules and governance environment design for a global engineering organisation's telecommunications €300m outsourcing contract. This allowed the organisation increased control of the contract across 60 countries with a reduced risk profile.
